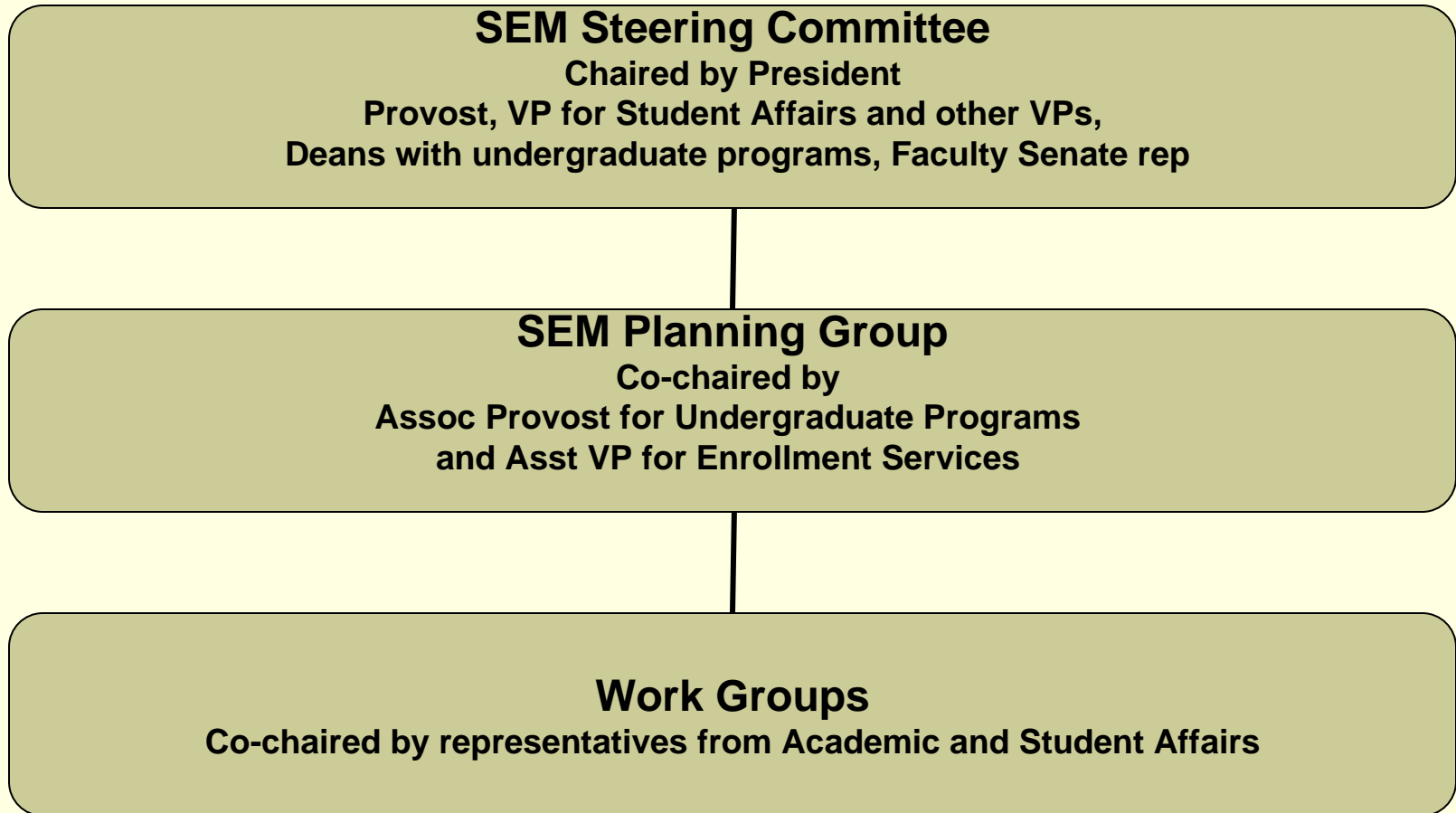

## Intergroup Dialog Program based on

- 2007-08 QEP grant through Academic Affairs to enhance ethics and civic responsibility in the curriculum
